

## Quill and Scroll







# TRACK TEAMS SPLIT AGAIN

## BOYS TRACK

After winning over Ipswich in week two, the word going around was that there was no real competition left for our boys in the regular season. That would seem to be the case, as on Tuesday night, our guys won 66 - 34 over the Manchester-Essex Hornets.

Starting off strong, the boys swept the 55 meter hurdles: Noah Blouin beat out Connor Scialdone for first, while Farid Tashi came in at a respectable third-place finish. He's made great progress in the hurdles since last indoor season, and we're all proud of him. Farid always brings a smile and a good attitude to practice and meets, and he's fondly held in the heart of the team as such.

In the 55 meter dash, the guys didn't perform as strongly. Joe Puleo, Sam Fortier, Tushka Joseph, and Oscar Lynch ran for 1-6-7-8, respectively. There was no contest for Puleo to win it, as none of the Hornets' runners went sub-seven seconds, but they had enough consistent guys--four who ran with times from 7.18 seconds to 7.38 seconds-- to fill second through fifth place. Puleo came third overall in the CAL with his time, consistent with his performance from the previous meet against Ipswich.

In the field events, our guys were as strong as always. Over at the long jump, our Redhawks jumped for 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 8th place. Blouin led it off with a leap of 19' 8.75", logging his second consecutive meet under 20 feet. Big ouch for the guy, but he's had a minor injury that barely resolved in time for the meet. We'd all love to see him over 20 feet again, but there's no ill-feelings for this meet. Puleo, Scialdone, and Aiden MacIntire took third, fifth, and eight places respectively. In the high jump, only two of our Redhawks competed, with Scialdone taking first place at 5' 6" and Brodie Hall coming in fifth at 4' 10". Hall's claims at jumping higher in his bare feet have started to seem a little bit unsubstantiated, but I'm sure he'll prove me wrong in the next meet against the Hamilton-Wenham Generals. At the shot put, it was a regular sweep, with Marcus Colon tossing his way back over fifty feet at 50' 8.75". Jack Harrington came in second

with a season-best throw of 43' 5", which has all of us very proud of him. Harrington's second throw, though a foul, was a much further distance. For the big guy, big things are coming. Yours truly landed a humble third place with a season-best 42' 10.5", logging a second consecutive meet with a season-best. In fourth place, notably, Dylan Palen returned back from his injuries to throw 39' 7". He wasn't too satisfied with the toss, but it's a big improvement from not throwing at all. For any observer, it was nice to see Palen back in action.

In the rest of the fast events, our guys were well-off. Maxx Rodrigues came in first at a speedy 1:29.47 in the 600, with Andrew Parsons and Dane Hall sweeping in for second and third at 1:38.29 and 1:39.08, respectively. For the 300, Puleo and Anthony Aguilar Lopez took first and third place. Over in the 4 by 200 meter relay, Aguilar-Lopez anchored and hawked down the Manchester-Essex runner to finish 0.28 seconds behind.

Over on the distance front, our guys were as strong as always. Josiah Fugate came close to a school record in the 1000 meter run, while the rest of our guys put up solid points in the one mile, two mile, and 4 by 400 meter relay.

The next test for our Redhawks is Friday the 16th in the state relays, and it'll be a close competition. With the consistent success of our guys this far, I'm sure they'll take home a strong result.

The girls' team didn't have that much luck, falling 43-56. The only firsts were Katherine Bigos in the high jump, Eva Hunt in the shot put, Hope Shannahan in the long jump, and the 1600 meter relay team of Shanahan, Della Hildt, Lexi Desmond, and Lauren Talbot.







## Boys' Basketball


After losing their first four games, the boys basketball team has come back with three wins in a row. Last Friday the boys beat winless Triton at home by a score of 71-59.








