
PASSING THE TORCH

MARCUS COLON


Senior Profile

AMESBURY/WHITTIER HOCKEY TEAM WINS BAKER DIVISION

Last Saturday night the hockey team defeated Pentucket 5-4. At one point Amesbury was ahead 5-3, but Pentucket took advantage of an Amesbury penalty to pull within one goal when time ran out. Jack Kusler, Evan Murphy, Whittier's Wes Ackerman (2) and Grady Stickney all scored for the Redhawks. Murphy, Stickney, Thomas McElaney, Lincoln Kime, and Tom Puorro all had assists. The win brought Amesbury's record to 10-7 and set up a battle with North Reading this past Wednesday for the CAL title.

Wednesday was senior night for Amesbury at the rink at Governor's

Academy. It was also a tribute night to the Amesbury Maples, a historic semi-pro hockey team which was famous here. It was the Maples 101st anniversary. It turned out that it also was the battle with North Reading for the CAL title. Win and Amesbury earns the title alone. Lose and share first place with North Reading.

The first period was all Amesbury. On Amesbury's first possession, Thomas McElaney tucked in a goal in the first 15 seconds. A minute later Thomas Puorro scored and then scored again later in the period. After one period it was 3-0 Amesbury. It wasn't for lack of trying by North Reading Whittier's Vince Foster

was pummeled in net but held strong.

The second period was all North Reading. The Hornets scored three times to bring the score to 3-3. And it stayed 3-3 throughout the whole third period and a five minute overtime. Since North Reading needed to win to get a share of the title, the Hornets pulled their goalie in the final moments of overtime with no result. The game ended tied and Amesbury took the title.








Redhawk Book Talk

Dube had 8 points and Sargent had 6.

The girls were scheduled to end their regular season at Lynnfield last night, but with a 10-6 record we can expect to see them in the playoffs.










Olivia McKay prepares for her free-throw.


The next day the Redhawks went to Rockport and got a 73-40 victory. DeLong had 24 points but




