


They only need to be 16 to pre-register and the deadline is October 26th.


CHECK OUT A BANNED BOOK

September 22-28 is **Banned Books Week**. This is when libraries focus on books that have been "challenged" which means there is a request to have a book removed from the shelves of a library. The American Library Association collects data on Book Challenges, and found over 4000 were targeted for censorship in 2023. Libraries work to defend everyone's right to read what they want under the First Amendment.

The ALA documented 4,240 unique book titles targeted for censorship in 2023—a 65% surge over 2022 numbers—as well as 1,247 demands to censor library books, materials, and resources. Pressure groups focused on public libraries in addition to targeting school libraries. The number of titles targeted for censorship at public libraries increased by 92% over the previous year, accounting for about 46% of all book challenges in 2023.

Many of the challenged books are famous and/or award winning books but they deal with topics like witchcraft or LGBTQ topics with may conflict with certain people's religion.


Football

The Redhawks football team met the Pentucket Panthers last Friday night at the new Pentucket field. Pentucket received the ball first and scored on their first possession. Amesbury took over and scored on their first possession. Pentucket got the ball back and scored. If you are detecting a pattern here, that is correct. At halftime it was 22-20 Amesbury.


In this game there were no turnovers on fumbles, only one turnover on downs, no interceptions, no punts, no kicking of PAT's. What there was was DJ DiCarlo running it up the middle. Pentucket tried everything to stop DiCarlo and he limped angrily off the field several times, only to return two plays later. DiCarlo scored in the first period, twice in the second and once in the third. He rushed for 142 yards and pulled in a 14 yard pass. He also pulled in six extra points. DiCarlo has put in solid performances in Amesbury's first two games, but against the Panthers he was THE MAN.

Sophomore Joe Puleo also picked 52 up yards for Amesbury and Ben Wood added 49. There was also passing, a very unusual thing for Amesbury, but QB Justin Dube seems to become more talented every week. He found five different receivers for the Redhawks, racking up 81 yards. Amesbury is now 2-1. They meet Lynnfield, also 2-1, at Lynnfield Friday night.

Lynnfield beat Ipswich 42-0 last week so this should be a challenging game.











Stephen King, one of the most famous horror authors in history, always spikes in popularity around the fall months, especially in October. In the spirit of horror stories and Halloween, I will be reviewing two of his most popular pieces of literature: IT and The Shining!



IT:

At first, I spent most of my free time every single day reading this book; I just couldn't put it down. I was invested in the book, always wanting to know more. Suddenly, one night as I was reading, it just hit a brick wall. I could not immerse myself in the story anymore. The book, a staggering 1,138 pages, could have been at least 300 pages shorter and would have been as good as people always describe it to be. In the 300+ pages that could have been removed were some disturbing descriptions and details about violent and disgusting acts as well as sexual content. Most of these unnecessary gross additions to the story took away from the main storyline and dragged it on, making it more difficult to read. There is a large amount of repetitive phrases in the story that, once read enough times, made me as a reader annoyed to spot them farther into the story. Although this is a personal opinion and many people would disagree with me, I give "IT" by Stephen King two out of five stars.



The Shining:

"The Shining" is one of my favorite books written by Stephen King. It is a hefty read, almost 450 pages long. It really expresses the true feelings people can develop about cabin fever, although dramatized. It did a wonderful job at portraying alcoholism and how it affects people who live with those who have an addiction. King has expressed multiple times that this book helped him realize his own issues with his struggle with alcohol and other addictions. He did a great job last incorporating details that seem small but are crucial to the story. The characters and their respective details and personality traits are well rounded, and none of the characters feel like they're incomplete. The slow slide readers see Jack in, leading towards his full and utter downward spiral into madness, driving him to become violent. This book led me to stay up into the later hours of the night, unable to put the book down. I give "The Shining" by Stephen King five out of five stars.



Dear Petunia,


